Sweethearts Share Love and Happiness



State General Baptists Elect a New Leader

On July 19-23, 2010 the General Missionary Baptist State Convention of Mississippi, Inc. held its convention here in Jackson which was the 121st annual session. The three main sites were the Downtown Marriot Hotel, New Hope Baptist Church, and the Jackson Convention Center. Mount Nebo was well represented by five voting delegates, namely: Pastor John A. Wicks, Jr., Sister Rosie Adams, Brother Frank Miller, Sister Artherine Buckley, and Sister Lula Curry. Sister Lula Holman also attended the convention as a delegate within the Usher Department. On Wednesday, July 21st, Dr. Isaic Jackson of Canton was elected the new president of the State Convention. Dr. Jackson defeated Pastor Jesse Horton of Jackson and Pastor Larry Hawkins of Pascagoula with well over 50% of the vote which eliminated the need for a runoff.

Also on Wednesday night, the Convention honored Dr. Jerry Young for 12 long years of sterling leadership at the state level. Pastor Wicks gave one of several tributes to Dr. Young. Pastor Wicks credited Dr. Young for helping him immensely as a youth and as an associate minister at New Hope Baptist Church. Other tributes came primarily from the presidents of the various auxiliaries within the convention. On Thursday night, Dr. Young gave his final address to the convention. He emphasized that much had been accomplished, but much was yet to be done. He said that Moses and other leaders in the Bible would carry God's vision a part of the way, then God would call another leader to carry on. Without a doubt, Dr. Young's tenure will be remembered as being highly successful. Moreover, this year's convention was one we will not soon forget.

We pray that the Lord keeps blessing the Mount Nebo Youth Ministry for continued growth,






Mount Nebo's Youth Ministry Presents "The Right Building on the Right Foundation"


